









# Welcome Back Walks 2021

#### Project Brief:

On May 17 2021 the UK Government withdrew some of the COVID 19 restrictions allowing groups of up to 30 unrelated people to gather outside in public spaces.

IW AONB with the assistance of AONB Partnership partners sort to deliver a programme of 'Welcome Back Walks' to entice and excite people into the fantastic countryside of the Isle of Wight.

As this programme was a first venture in to delivering individual bespoke walking activities a wide variety of types of experiences were considered these included hiking, rock pooling, storytelling, long walks and shorter historic trail walks.

The programme of walks were delivered from May 17 2021 to July 31 2021. This is considered a shoulder tourist season to the main tourist season of 31 July – 4 September 2021.

#### Walk Leaders:

At the end of March 2021, IW AONB enquired with partners organisations and individuals, who had previously led walks, whether there would be an appetite to look to deliver a walks programme as the UK 'opened up'. Walk leaders were a self-selected group of 5 different individuals or organisations, understandably most previous walk leaders did not want to undertake walks due to COVID 19 restrictions.

IW AONB sent out a brief for the walks to ensure those who had shown interest wanted to comply with the restrictions:

### Welcome Back Walks

IW AONB and Isle of Wight World UNESCO Biosphere Reserve Guided Walks Summer 2021

- 1. Guided walks programme runs from 17th May to 31st July 11 weeks
- 2. Programme consists of 20 walks or 4 per walk leader / partner
- 3. Each walk starts from a bus stop or train station exception for urban walks / from town centre or well know civic structure.
- 4. Walk details advertise bus or train and walk coincides with bus / train timetable.
- 5. Up to 30 people attending. Some people have specified a max of 15.
- 6. 2hr in length with an element of walking in it.
- 7. Book through IWAONB this will be using Event Brite and will be set up by 30th April 2021.
- 8. Advertise entire programme on AONB and Biosphere website and Visit Isle of Wight Website
- 9. Weekly notification / reminder on IWAONB Facebook Walk leaders to share walks using their own social media presence.
- 10. Organiser comes up with dates negotiation may be necessary if clashes occur.
- 11. Walk Leaders to notify AONB as soon as possible if there is a problem or need to cancel.
- 12. Walks leaders can claim £100 for each successfully delivered walk, this is payable on receipt of an invoice to IW AONB.

13. Please could you undertake a risk assessment for your walk.

Reporting to IWAONB, what we need to know:

- 1. How many attendees
- 2. How long the walking element was approx. / actual
- 3. IWAONB to produce Freepost postcards (1000) for walk leaders to distribute card will be blank so respondents can be creative about their feedback. Postcard will include questions:
  - a. How did you get to the start of the walk?
  - b. Did you enjoy the walk rate 1-5?
  - c. Would you do the walk again without the leader / self-guided?







### Kathy Grogan:

#### Learning Points:

The adults who came without children were surprised that it was a family event, with activities for children.

Family Nature Night 2

#### Positives:

All respondents gave a 5 out of 5 for quality of the walk.

Everyone seemed to enjoy it. We even had fireworks at the end, with the Needles firework display visible while we were still monitoring bats with the bat detector on the way back along the estuary.

#### Learning Points:

13 people on this walk - 7 adults and 6 children. Only two of this group had tickets from Event Brite.

Some confusion over the start point of the walk for one participant.

#### Spencer Brown

#### **Positives**

All respondents gave 5 out of 5 for the Walks.

Comments such as:

"We loved it"

"Excellent walk"

"Loved the sense of ancient ways. You could feel the atmosphere."

"Very pleasant walk, very well lead – leader very agreeable and knowledgeable. Delighted to have found this walk."

#### Learning Points:

Euro 2020 (and England matches) influence whether people turned up for the Walks.

### **Project Review**

The walk guides attended a review meeting on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> August at 2pm, Newport. The meeting examined:

# How did walk leaders feel the programme went.

The response was positive and there was an appetite to deliver a similar event in 2022. A varied walks programme was thought to be very positive.

There are people who want to walk but need the encouragement of a group and a fixed time.

Short walks - 3-4 miles is more than enough and 2 hours is long enough for guided walks. Many people who partook preferred a slow pace, with time to stop to admire what is to be seen in terms of the view, the flora and the fauna.

People identified that having a leader to begin the explanation and allows others to contribute, is highly valued.

# Feedback from participants and Joel (back office issues)

There were some problems with getting the correct information on the website and it was recommended that a standardised form for information about the walk should be produced.

#### Conclusion

The event programme was a success and Government restrictions in place surrounding COVID 19 were possible to work with while delivering outdoor events.

A short programme leading up to the main tourist season was well received, and a more focused event week (School Half Term in this case) was considered an important part of the success of the events.

The date of the events in 2022 will be a little earlier in the year to coincide with the Easter Holiday / School Term Break to allow more visitors the opportunity to attend.

Advertising was successful through social media, however advertising to a wider audience in 2022 will need to include Visit Isle of Wight and advertising in Island tourist magazines and newspapers.

Throughout the event there were no reported cases of COVID 19 to report; however, in 2022, if the Trace App is still being used by the UK Government then participants may be required to register their participation. As COVID 19 is a changing landscape it is difficult to know what restrictions will be in place for 2022.
